Fairness for all is the foundation for a competitive, efficient and consumer focused market to ensure sustainable growth and innovation. Unlike the Nordic markets, most markets in Europe have been addressing Unfair Trading Practice (UTP) either through legal regulation or via voluntary code of practice. In UK, the Grocery Code Adjudicator has made remarkable achievements through legal regulations. Norway is following suit with a new Law on Fair Trading in the Markeing and EU has now proposed a directive targeting Unfair Trading Practices in businessto-business relationsships in the food supply chain, setting a minimum standard for Europe.

At this conference you will be introduced to the UK model and the achievements of the GSCOP and to the propsed directive - both the political process and a perspectie on how it will impact the market. Does the directive address the local challenges, or do we need to supplement it with local initiatives?

The conference is organized by Nordic grocery suppliers' associations: ETL Finland, DLF Sweden, DLF Norway and MLDK Denmark.
